ANR's main features

- **A public organisation:**

Devoted to competitive project-based funding
in both fundamental and applied research

- **2010 budget : 853 M€**

- **Instruments:**

- ✓ 55 - 60 Calls /year (in average)

- **Peer-review evaluation of projects:**

- ✓ ~ 6000 projects submitted yearly

European and International cooperation 2010 Key figures

- **12% of ANR funded projects are co funded with other funding Agencies/ministries**

160 co-funded projects, **48** M€ of funding

Selection rate: **16.6%**

- Transnational projects with 28 countries

- **Germany by far first foreign partner**

From 2006 to 2010:
295 projects with German partners co-funded
ANR funding: **84 M €**

ANR –DFG calls in Social Science and Humanities

- 2007-2011 Bilateral call ANR-DFG in social sciences and humanities : 86 projects co - funded

ORA open research area

- Extended since 2010: Quadrilateral call ANR-DFG-ESRC-NWO in social sciences since 2010
- 2011 ORA call in Social Science with India-D-Fr-NL-UK.
 - Use of mutual networks /contacts to ease implementation of collaboration
 - Do not duplicate effort ex archeology

ANR-BMBF life science

- Cardiovascular and metabolic diseases
 - 2009 Bilateral call ANR-BMBF
 - 2011 extended to Multilateral FR-D-Canada, Quebec, Spain
- Plant Genomics
 - 2006-2009 D-Fr-Sp
 - 2010 D -Fr- Sp-PT-CA

G8 HORCS multidisciplinary calls

- Bring together key funding agencies in G8 countries (CA, D, FR, JP, RU, UK, USA) to fund multilateral research projects to address global challenges.
- Evaluation process already experimented between ANR, DFG, RCUK implemented very rapidly
 - Call 2010: Interdisciplinary Program on Application Software towards Exascale Computing for Global Scale Issues’.
 - Call 2011: Material Efficiency – A First Step towards Sustainable

ANR-BMBF Civil/Global security

- Collaboration since 2009
- 2011 : 10 projects /48 proposals
- Last FR-D forum: ambition towards creation of a common technological reference / Standard devoted to the protection of critical infrastructures
- Shape european roadmap

Perspectives

- Use mutual networks /infrastructures to ease collaboration
- When relevant avoid duplication of effort but coordinate
- Discuss and share common/coordinated FR-D policy of collaboration with countries out of europe
