G8 HORCS multidisciplinary calls

- Bring together key funding agencies in G8 countries (CA, D, FR, JP, RU, UK, USA) to fund multilateral research projects to address global challenges.
- Evaluation process already experimented between ANR, DFG, RCUK implemented very rapidly
 - Call 2010: Interdisciplinary Program on Application Software towards Exascale Computing for Global Scale Issues'.
 - Call 2011: Material Efficiency A First Step towards Sustainable

ANR-BMBF Civil/Global security

- Collaboration since 2009
- · 2011: 10 projects /48 proposals

- Last FR-D forum: ambition towards creation of a common technological reference / Standard devoted to the protection of critical infrastructures
